Join the Zionsville Concert Band for a variety-filled musical evening on Thursday, April 20, 2017, at 6:45 p.m. in the sanctuary of the Hoosier Village Chapel. The concert is entitled “From Bach to Broadway” and will feature many different styles and eras from our multi-national musical heritage.

Composers J.S. Bach, W.A. Mozart, John Philip

Sousa, Karl King, Henry Fillmore, Johann Strauss, Sigmund Romberg, Engelbert Humperdinck, and Frederick Lowe (of the famed Broadway duo Lerner and Lowe) will be represented in a program that includes marches, classical baroque music, a Mozart overture, waltzes, ragtime, and dixieland.

As a special feature, the band will take you on a

musical adventure to the heart of the French Quarter in New Orleans to treat you to jazz heard at the legendary Preservation Hall, where Zionsville Concert Band’s own dixieland ensemble will play three well-known favorites from the New Orleans tradition.

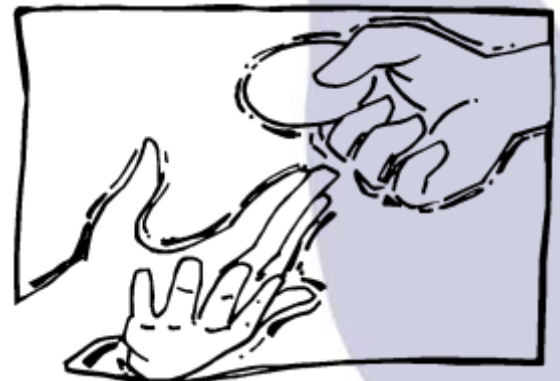
