Zionsville Concert Band will open the Zionsville Lions Club Summer concert series on Sunday, July 2, 2017, at 7:00 p.m. in Lions Park with a concert entitled “Marches and Waltzes.”

The program features beloved patriotic music, including “God Bless America” and John Phillip Sousa’s “Stars and Stripes Forever,” our country’s official national march.
